HOW TO READ “NEXT”

You picked up NEXT! Now what? You're on your way to read it, dig it and live it.

READ IT

Let's start with the basics. The Gospel of John was written by one of Jesus' closest followers almost 2,000 years ago. John records for us his eyewitness account of Jesus. He says near the end of the book why he wrote it: "These are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:31).

John's book has 21 chapters, short sections each featuring part of Jesus' story. Read through it at your own pace; I'd suggest one, two, or three chapters a day. Some are longer than others, but all are filled with truth about who Jesus is and how we can live.

DIG IT

Sometimes it's not enough to just read. If you've ever walked into a pop quiz without studying, you know what I mean. If you want to know Jesus, skimming the Bible just won't cut it.

God didn't give us a textbook. He gave us the greatest story ever written. The Bible is God's letter to you personally, and He wants to speak to you every day.

For every three chapters in the Gospel of John, I've inserted a short devotional and a few questions for you to think about from those three chapters. Understanding how God is speaking to you personally requires reflection on your part. And reflection leads us to action.

LIVE IT

Let's say you wake up in the morning, walk into the bathroom and see your disheveled hair. Then you turn away, walk out the door and head to work. Problem? Your hair is a mess!

The Bible says this is what it's like when you read God's Word but don't do anything about it (James 1:23-24). You can read the Bible and think about the Bible, but unless you live what you read, nothing is changed. You cannot know Jesus and stay the same.

How will you live out what you read in this book? Learn who Jesus is, then live like Jesus lived.

INTRODUCTION

What's up? Let me just say I am stoked that you grabbed the NEXT Book. I don't pretend to read minds, but I'm going to guess that by starting to read this book, you fall into one of four categories:

1. You just made a first-time commitment to follow Jesus.
2. You have known about God for a long time and have even used the label "Christian," but now Jesus is coming alive in your life.
3. You are wondering about this whole "Jesus" thing, and you have questions.
4. You like free stuff or raised your hand so others would think you were super spiritual.

Whatever your story, I am praying for you right now — that God would take the words on the following pages and use them in your life. Whoever you are and wherever you're at, God wants to speak to you.

THE NEED FOR A FRESH START ISN'T HARD TO FIND.

Every day I talk to people who are hurt and broken, looking for meaning but only finding emptiness. Maybe their pain came from others or maybe they inflicted it on themselves. All they know is that they can't wash away life's filth.

The Bible tells us that God is good and created us to be with Him. But in our rebellion, each one of us has rejected God's authority. God is life, and trying to do life on our own will only result in death. God is right to punish us for rejecting Him.

"All have sinned and fall short of God." – Romans 3:23

"The wages of sin is death." – Romans 6:23

Something is missing. Habits, addictions and relationships will never satisfy our deepest longing.

WE NEED A SAVIOR . . . AND THIS IS WHERE JESUS COMES IN.

“For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast.” – Ephesians 2:8-9

Being a good person doesn't get you into heaven. Only through Jesus, the perfect Son of God, can you be saved. Jesus came and died on the cross to take the punishment of your sin. Why? Because He loves you. Jesus defeated sin and death once and for all when He rose from the grave!

JESUS MADE IT POSSIBLE FOR YOU TO LIVE A NEW LIFE.

“If you confess with your mouth, Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.”
– Romans 10:9

“Yet to all who did receive Him, to those who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God.” – John 1:12

Right now, you can surrender your life to Jesus. This is where the NEXT step of your journey with Jesus begins. Whether this is the first time you have surrendered your life or you're rededicating your life, pray to God and ask Him to forgive you for your sins and to help you live a new life, saved by Jesus.

WE NEED EACH OTHER.

You and I were never intended for loneliness and isolation. Just like a relay race, God created us to run this race together.

Jesus called His followers into a group to learn, follow and grow together. He calls us to love one another just as He loves us.

By sharing life with other followers of Jesus, you can grow in faith, make some of the best friends you've ever had and understand God's love more.

“And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another.” – Hebrews 10:24-25

Together, you and I are called “to love and good works.” In other words, we're called to love and live out a life changed by Jesus.

UNITED IN LOVE

Living life together is at the center of living the NEXT journey with Jesus.

God's love binds us together, enabling us to celebrate differences and help each other through struggles and weaknesses.

Through God's Spirit, who is known as the Holy Spirit, you're brought into the family of God. Every barrier between people is removed and replaced by the love of Jesus.

Together we run after Jesus, following His teaching, serving like He served and praying like He taught us to pray. The Church is an authentic community of people from all languages, generations and ethnicities united by Jesus.

There has never been a church of perfect people. There has always and only been the Church of the perfect God.

UNITED ON MISSION

If your picture of church has been a bunch of religious people sitting around singing "Kumbaya," then you're missing out on the passionate and active mission of Jesus and His people.

When you stand for Jesus, it means aligning your heart with the heart of God. Hard and often unpopular, following Jesus means standing for what Jesus stood for.

Jesus is passionate about showing His goodness by changing lives. Do we demonstrate the transforming love of Jesus by freeing modern-day slaves or feeding the hungry? How about demonstrating love by unloading the dishwasher without being asked?

The mission of Jesus is to make His name famous. The mission of the Church is to make Jesus famous, together.

INSTRUCTION

Whether you are a new believer or have lived as a Christian for a long time, you need to realize the importance of walking by God's map — the Bible.

The Bible is called the Word of God. Why? Because the same God who created the stars into existence and saved your life through Jesus will also speak to you in the Bible.

More than a textbook or required reading, the Bible is the living Word of God, and He's speaking to you through His Word.

BUT WHAT IS GOD SPEAKING?

Throughout the pages of the Bible, we see a map laid out about how to follow Jesus. Some of it is practical, where God tells us how to make wise choices in life. Other parts of it tell stories of God moving in ages past, working His story into history.

To be clear: The best part about the Bible is that it allows us to know God, His love and His purpose in saving us. In the Bible we see our own brokenness, and we see everything God did through Jesus so that we can be changed from the inside out.

This book you're reading is only an excerpt of all God has spoken in the Bible.

LEARNING TO LISTEN

Just like you would want to learn music from your favorite artist or take a math lesson from Einstein, studying the Bible is coming to listen and learn from the expert and creator of the universe — God. So don't come to the Bible thinking you have all the answers, but come as a student expecting one incredible lesson.

Like most things in life, what you put into reading the Bible is what you'll get out of it. If you treat it as just another boring textbook or a manual, it won't change you. BUT, if you see this book as the Word of God, it has the power to move in your life and transform you. God is looking for people who will take Him at His Word.

COMMUNICATION

At the heart of every relationship is communication. You can't have a good relationship if only one person talks.

DON'T GIVE GOD THE SILENT TREATMENT.

On the previous pages, we looked at how God has spoken to us — through the Bible. In the Bible you learn that God loves you unconditionally. But how are you going to know God's love if you don't spend any time with Him? It's your turn to talk to God.

Prayer is simply talking to God. He wants to hear your voice. Like a true friend, God calls you to “cast all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you” (1 Peter 5:7).

God loves you, and that means God always has your best interest in mind. If you read the Book of Psalms, you see time and again how the writer pours out his heart to God. God can see every part of your life, so why try to hide your worries?

WHEN WE PRAY, GOD MOVES.

Prayer is about developing our relationship with God and then carrying that relationship into every area of your life. Prayer develops intimacy and boldness.

INTIMACY

Every deep friendship is built around intimacy — those matters of your heart that you only share with your closest friends. You only want to share with someone who will truly understand and love you.

INTIMACY (cont.)

Intimacy takes time to build. You can feel a true, deep love for Jesus when you accept Him as Savior. As one wise man once said, “Love is spontaneous, but it must be maintained through discipline.”

Two ways to build intimacy with God are through vulnerability and remembrance. Vulnerability I already talked about — God isn’t scared to confront your deepest worries and fears. Remembrance, on the other hand, is thankfulness for all God has done in your life. If you’ve come to Jesus, then you have something to give God thanks for! More than that, thankfulness can extend to every area of your life.

“Give thanks in all circumstances.” – 1 Thessalonians 5:18

BOLDNESS

The natural outflow of intimacy is boldness.

“Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith.”

– Hebrews 10:22

Because of Jesus’ death on the cross, you and I have full access to God. This is a powerful truth! If you pursue intimacy with God, then your heart will start to beat like God’s heart. You will start loving what God loves and hating what God hates. And His life will overflow from your life into the lives of those around you.

Whether you’re by yourself or with a group of people, don’t miss the incredible opportunity to pray. Stay connected with God through prayer and experience life together with your Savior. You won’t regret it.

SHARING

THE MESSAGE OF JESUS IS MEANT TO BE SHARED.

Has Jesus changed your life? Then you have a story to share with the world. Your story isn't so much about you, but it shows others the immense love of God.

Think about your story. The reason you came to Jesus is likely because somebody told you. Maybe it was a friend, a parent, or an evangelist from North Dakota.

However it happened, you're here now because somebody shared his or her testimony about Jesus with you. Take a moment to think through your story.

KNOW YOUR STORY.

Think through these three questions to help you understand your salvation story:

1. How did you hear the Gospel and decide to stand for Jesus?
2. What circumstances in your life made you realize your need for Jesus?
3. How has God started the NEXT journey in your life through Jesus?

Write out the answers to these questions, and remind yourself often of God's salvation in your life.

You have a testimony, and it's your turn to share.

SHARE YOUR STORY.

There's a time and a place to stand on a stage and share about Jesus. But the message of Jesus was never meant to be kept to Sunday morning services and special concert events. The message of Jesus is meant to be shared in relationship with one another, both in the Church and outside the Church. When Jesus died on the cross and rose from the dead, He left one final commandment with His followers:

“And Jesus came and said to them, ‘All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.’” – Matthew 28:18-20

Followers of Jesus are made to make followers of Jesus. Alone, your story won't change anyone. But with the help of Jesus and the Holy Spirit living inside of you, His light shines through you.

You know people who don't know Jesus. The question is whether you'll allow the message that has changed your life to change theirs, too.

You don't know all the answers, and you still have a lot to learn about what it means to follow Jesus. But you have a story from a Savior who gave His life so that you could have life. You were broken, but you've been made new. Share it with the world.

A FINAL WORD

Thank you so much for reading this book and learning what it means to live as a follower of Jesus. I'm proud of you!

After you read this, you may have more questions than answers about what it means to follow Jesus. That's good, and God's not scared of any questions you ask of Him.

Maybe you're reading through this material and thinking to yourself, "I'll never be able to do all of this!"

Never fear. Following Jesus is a journey, not an overnight transformation. Yes, Jesus has saved you by His death and resurrection, and if you trust in Him, you have eternal life. As we continue to journey with Jesus, God through the Holy Spirit will continue to transform your life.

This book is designed to give you a glimpse of what it means to live and love like Jesus. These short lessons on community, instruction, communication and sharing all blend together as parts of a transformed life in Jesus.

By living in community with the Church, you learn more from God's instruction book, the Bible. As you learn more from the Bible, you develop a deeper intimacy in communication with God through prayer. By praying, you grow in your boldness and share the witness of what Jesus has done in your life. In sharing life and the Gospel with others, you build the very community you were brought into.

The message of Jesus is far more than a history lesson, a nice story, or a motivational speech. The Gospel is an invitation — an invitation to admit you're broken and to receive new life from Jesus.

JOHN

THE WORD BECAME FLESH

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God. ³All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴In him was life,¹ and the life was the light of men. ⁵The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ⁸He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

⁹The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. ¹¹He came to his own,² and his own people³ did not receive him. ¹²But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, ¹³who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

¹⁴And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. ¹⁵(John bore witness about him, and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, because he was before me.'") ¹⁶And from his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. ¹⁷For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. ¹⁸No one has ever seen God; the only God,⁴ who is at the Father's side,⁵ he has made him known.

THE TESTIMONY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

¹⁹And this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" ²⁰He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." ²¹And they asked him, "What then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No." ²²So they said to him, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about

yourself?" ²³He said, "I am ^athe voice of one crying out in the wilderness, 'Make straight⁶ the way of the Lord,' as the prophet Isaiah said."

²⁴(Now they had been sent from the Pharisees.) ²⁵They asked him, "Then why are you baptizing, if you are neither the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the Prophet?" ²⁶John answered them, "I baptize with water, but among you stands one you do not know, ²⁷even he who comes after me, the strap of whose sandal I am not worthy to untie." ²⁸These things took place in Bethany across the Jordan, where John was baptizing.

BEHOLD, THE LAMB OF GOD

²⁹The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" ³⁰This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks before me, because he was before me.' ³¹I myself did not know him, but for this purpose I came baptizing with water, that he might be revealed to Israel." ³²And John bore witness: "I saw the Spirit descend from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. ³³I myself did not know him, but he who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' ³⁴And I have seen and have borne witness that this is the Son of God."

JESUS CALLS THE FIRST DISCIPLES

³⁵The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples, ³⁶and he looked at Jesus as he walked by and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!" ³⁷The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. ³⁸Jesus turned and saw them following and said to them, "What are you seeking?" And they said to him, "Rabbi!" (which means Teacher), "where are you staying?" ³⁹He said to them, "Come and you will see." So they came and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day, for it was about the tenth hour.⁷ ⁴⁰One of the two who heard John speak and followed Jesus⁸ was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. ⁴¹He first found his own brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (w h i c h m e a n s

Christ).⁴² He brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "So you are Simon the son of John? You shall be called Cephas" (which means Peter¹).

JESUS CALLS PHILIP AND NATHANAEAL

⁴³The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me."⁴⁴ Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter.⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."⁴⁶ Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see."⁴⁷ Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said of him, "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no deceit!"⁴⁸ Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you."⁴⁹ Nathanael answered him, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!"⁵⁰ Jesus answered him, "Because I said to you, 'I saw you under the fig tree,' do you believe? You will see greater things than these."⁵¹ And he said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you,² you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

THE WEDDING AT CANA

2 On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.² Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples.³ When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine."⁴ And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come."⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

⁶ Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons.³ ⁷ Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim.⁸ And he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So they took it.⁹ When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom¹⁰ and said to

him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now."¹¹ This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

¹² After this he went down to Capernaum, with his mother and his brothers⁴ and his disciples, and they stayed there for a few days.

JESUS CLEANSSES THE TEMPLE

¹³ The Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.¹⁴ In the temple he found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there.¹⁵ And making a whip of cords, he drove them all out of the temple, with the sheep and oxen. And he poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables.¹⁶ And he told those who sold the pigeons, "Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade."¹⁷ His disciples remembered that it was written,⁵ "Zeal for your house will consume me."

¹⁸ So the Jews said to him, "What sign do you show us for doing these things?"¹⁹ Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."²⁰ The Jews then said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will you raise it up in three days?"²¹ But he was speaking about the temple of his body.²² When therefore he was raised from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.

JESUS KNOWS WHAT IS IN MAN

²³ Now when he was in Jerusalem at the Passover Feast, many believed in his name when they saw the signs that he was doing.²⁴ But Jesus on his part did not entrust himself to them, because he knew all people²⁵ and needed no one to bear witness about man, for he himself knew what was in man.

YOU MUST BE BORN AGAIN

3 Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews.² This man came to Jesus⁵ by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him."³ Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say

¹ Cephas and Peter are from the word for rock in Aramaic and Greek, respectively ²The Greek for you is plural; twice in this verse ³ Greek two or three measures (metrētēs); a metrētēs was about 10 gallons or 35 liters ⁴ Or brothers and sisters. to you, unless one is born again¹ he cannot see the kingdom of God.”⁴ Nicodemus said to him, “How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother’s womb and be born?”⁵ Jesus answered, “Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God.⁶ That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.² Do not marvel that I said to you, ‘You³ must be born again.’⁸ The wind⁴ blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.”

⁹Nicodemus said to him, “How can these things be?”¹⁰ Jesus answered him, “Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things?¹¹ Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you⁵ do not receive our testimony.¹² If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things?¹³ No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man.⁶ And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up,¹⁴ that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.⁷

FOR GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD

¹⁶For God so loved the world,⁸ that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.¹⁹ And this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil.²⁰ For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed.²¹ But whoever does what is true comes to the light, so that it may be clearly seen that his works have been carried out in God.”

JOHN THE BAPTIST EXALTS CHRIST

²²After this Jesus and his disciples went into the Judean countryside, and he remained

there with them and was baptizing.²³ John also was baptizing at Aenon near Salim, because water was plentiful there, and people were coming and being baptized²⁴ (for John had not yet been put in prison).

²⁵Now a discussion arose between some of John’s disciples and a Jew over purification.²⁶ And they came to John and said to him, “Rabbi, he who was with you across the Jordan, to whom you bore witness—look, he is baptizing, and all are going to him.”²⁷ John answered, “A person cannot receive even one thing unless it is given him from heaven.²⁸ You yourselves bear me witness, that I said, ‘I am not the Christ, but I have been sent before him.’²⁹ The one who has the bride is the bridegroom. The friend of the bridegroom, who stands and hears him, rejoices greatly at the bridegroom’s voice. Therefore this joy of mine is now complete.³⁰ He must increase, but I must decrease.”²⁹

³¹He who comes from above is above all. He who is of the earth belongs to the earth and speaks in an earthly way. He who comes from heaven is above all.³² He bears witness to what he has seen and heard, yet no one receives his testimony.³³ Whoever receives his testimony sets his seal to this, that God is true.³⁴ For he whom God has sent utters the words of God, for he gives the Spirit without measure.³⁵ The Father loves the Son and has given all things into his hand.³⁶ Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever does not obey the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God remains on him.

JESUS AND THE WOMAN OF SAMARIA

4 Now when Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard that Jesus was making and baptizing more disciples than John² (although Jesus himself did not baptize, but only his disciples),³ he left Judea and departed again for Galilee.⁴ And he had to pass through Samaria.⁵ So he came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the field that Jacob had given to his son Joseph.⁶ Jacob’s well was there; so Jesus, wearied as he was from his journey, was sitting beside the well. It was about the sixth hour.¹⁰

⁷A woman from Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, “Give me a drink.”⁸ (For his disciples had gone away into the city to buy food.)⁹ The Samaritan woman said to him, “How is it that you, a Jew, ask for a drink

WHO IS JESUS?

TO READ

John 1-3: Who is Jesus?

- Jesus is the Word (God), man, the Son of God (John 1)
- Jesus celebrates and Jesus gets angry (John 2)
- Jesus is the Savior (John 3)

Life is full of big questions. Where should I go to school? Should I get married? What kind of career should I pursue? Would I rather that my pet bunny was a pirate or ninja?

Who is Jesus? Of all of life's questions, this is the most important.

Maybe you've heard this question from a TV preacher, but now it's time to ask yourself. If you think about it, the answer to this question changes everything. If Jesus was just a good teacher, then you respect Him like you respect Gandhi — he was a good guy who said good things and then died a cruel death.

In the first three chapters of John, there is a big-picture view of who Jesus is. John says, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (1:1). From the very beginning, John wants to make it clear — Jesus is not a mere human. He always has been and always will be God.

But it's not enough to say that Jesus is God. To fully understand the story, we must know that He walked on earth as a human: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us" (1:14).

What makes the Bible so fascinating and revolutionary is that God witnessed our coming destruction and decided to do something about it — Jesus became one of us! Jesus was a man who celebrated with friends, cried with family and got angry at wrongdoing. The difference between Jesus and us? Jesus lived a perfect life — He never sinned. Then He offered His life for us when He died on the cross.

Only Jesus can save us. As God, He has the power to take us out or give us life, forgiveness and healing. Jesus understands your pain, grief and shame. As a man, Jesus has experienced life's high and lows. Jesus can relate with you. He is our Savior.

“For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.”
– John 3:16

from me, a woman of Samaria?" (For Jews have no dealings with Samaritans.) ¹⁰Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." ¹¹The woman said to him, "Sir, you have nothing to draw water with, and the well is deep. Where do you get that living water? ¹²Are you greater than our father Jacob? He gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did his sons and his livestock." ¹³Jesus said to her, "Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴but whoever drinks of the water that I will give him will never be thirsty again.¹ The water that I will give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." ¹⁵The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I will not be thirsty or have to come here to draw water."

¹⁶Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here." ¹⁷The woman answered him, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You are right in saying, 'I have no husband'; ¹⁸for you have had five husbands, and the one you now have is not your husband. What you have said is true." ¹⁹The woman said to him, "Sir, I perceive that you are a prophet. ²⁰Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you say that in Jerusalem is the place where people ought to worship." ²¹Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe me, the hour is coming when neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem will you worship the Father. ²²You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. ²⁴God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." ²⁵The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." ²⁶Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am he."

²⁷Just then his disciples came back. They marveled that he was talking with a woman, but no one said, "What do you seek?" or, "Why are you talking with her?" ²⁸So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, ²⁹"Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" ³⁰They went out of the town and were coming to him.

³¹Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, saying, "Rabbi, eat." ³²But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you do not know about." ³³So the disciples said to one another, "Has anyone brought him something to eat?" ³⁴Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work. ³⁵Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. ³⁶Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. ³⁷For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.' ³⁸I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor."

³⁹Many Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me all that I ever did." ⁴⁰So when the Samaritans came to him, they asked him to stay with them, and he stayed there two days. ⁴¹And many more believed because of his word. ⁴²They said to the woman, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world."

⁴³After the two days he departed for Galilee. ⁴⁴(For Jesus himself had testified that a prophet has no honor in his own hometown.) ⁴⁵So when he came to Galilee, the Galileans welcomed him, having seen all that he had done in Jerusalem at the feast. For they too had gone to the feast.

JESUS HEALS AN OFFICIAL'S SON

⁴⁶So he came again to Cana in Galilee, where he had made the water wine. And at Capernaum there was an official whose son was ill. ⁴⁷When this man heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went to him and asked him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. ⁴⁸So Jesus said to him, "Unless you see signs and wonders you will not believe." ⁴⁹The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my child dies." ⁵⁰Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and went on his way. ⁵¹As he was going down, his servants met him and told him that his son was recovering. ⁵²So he asked them the hour when he began to get better, and they said to him, "Yesterday at the

seventh hour¹ the fever left him.”⁵³ The father knew that was the hour when Jesus had said to him, “Your son will live.” And he himself believed, and all his household.⁵⁴ This was now the second sign that Jesus did when he had come from Judea to Galilee.

THE HEALING AT THE POOL ON THE SABBATH

5 After this there was a feast of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

² Now there is in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Aramaic² called Bethesda,³ which has five roofed colonnades. ³ In these lay a multitude of invalids—blind, lame, and paralyzed.⁴ ⁵ One man was there who had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. ⁶ When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had already been there a long time, he said to him, “Do you want to be healed?” ⁷ The sick man answered him, “Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, and while I am going another steps down before me.” ⁸ Jesus said to him, “Get up, take up your bed, and walk.” ⁹ And at once the man was healed, and he took up his bed and walked.

Now that day was the Sabbath. ¹⁰ So the Jews said to the man who had been healed, “It is the Sabbath, and it is not lawful for you to take up your bed.” ¹¹ But he answered them, “The man who healed me, that man said to me, ‘Take up your bed, and walk.’” ¹² They asked him, “Who is the man who said to you, ‘Take up your bed and walk?’” ¹³ Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place. ¹⁴ Afterward Jesus found him in the temple and said to him, “See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse may happen to you.” ¹⁵ The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him. ¹⁶ And this was why the Jews were persecuting Jesus, because he was doing these things on the Sabbath. ¹⁷ But Jesus answered them, “My Father is working until now, and I am working.”

JESUS IS EQUAL WITH GOD

¹⁸ This was why the Jews were seeking all the more to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God.

THE AUTHORITY OF THE SON

¹⁹ So Jesus said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of his own

accord, but only what he sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father⁵ does, that the Son does likewise. ²⁰ For the Father loves the Son and shows him all that he himself is doing. And greater works than these will he show him, so that you may marvel. ²¹ For as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whom he will. ²² The Father judges no one, but has given all judgment to the Son, ²³ that all may honor the Son, just as they honor the Father. Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent him. ²⁴ Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life.

²⁵ “Truly, truly, I say to you, an hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. ²⁶ For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son also to have life in himself. ²⁷ And he has given him authority to execute judgment, because he is the Son of Man. ²⁸ Do not marvel at this, for an hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear his voice ²⁹ and come out, those who have done good to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil to the resurrection of judgment.

WITNESSES TO JESUS

³⁰ “I can do nothing on my own. As I hear, I judge, and my judgment is just, because I seek not my own will but the will of him who sent me. ³¹ If I alone bear witness about myself, my testimony is not deemed true. ³² There is another who bears witness about me, and I know that the testimony that he bears about me is true. ³³ You sent to John, and he has borne witness to the truth. ³⁴ Not that the testimony that I receive is from man, but I say these things so that you may be saved. ³⁵ He was a burning and shining lamp, and you were willing to rejoice for a while in his light. ³⁶ But the testimony that I have is greater than that of John. For the works that the Father has given me to accomplish, the very works that I am doing, bear witness about me that the Father has sent me. ³⁷ And the Father who sent me has himself borne witness about me. His voice you have never heard, his form you have never seen, ³⁸ and you do not have his word abiding in you, for

you do not believe the one whom he has sent. ³⁹You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is they that bear witness about me, ⁴⁰yet you refuse to come to me that you may have life. ⁴¹I do not receive glory from people. ⁴²But I know that you do not have the love of God within you. ⁴³I have come in my Father's name, and you do not receive me. If another comes in his own name, you will receive him. ⁴⁴How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the only God? ⁴⁵Do not think that I will accuse you to the Father. There is one who accuses you: Moses, on whom you have set your hope. ⁴⁶For if you believed Moses, you would believe me; for he wrote of me. ⁴⁷But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe my words?"

JESUS FEEDS THE FIVE THOUSAND

6 After this ¹Jesus went away to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, which is the Sea of Tiberias. ²And a large crowd was following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing on the sick. ³Jesus went up on the mountain, and there he sat down with his disciples. ⁴Now the Passover, the feast of the Jews, was at hand. ⁵Lifting up his eyes, then, and seeing that a large crowd was coming toward him, Jesus said to Philip, "Where are we to buy bread, so that these people may eat?" ⁶He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he would do. ⁷Philip answered him, "Two hundred denarii¹ would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." ⁸One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, ⁹"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish, but what are they for so many?" ¹⁰Jesus said, "Have the people sit down." Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, about five thousand in number. ¹¹Jesus then took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated. So also the fish, as much as they wanted. ¹²And when they had eaten their fill, he told his disciples, "Gather up the leftover fragments, that nothing may be lost." ¹³So they gathered them up and filled twelve baskets with fragments from the five barley loaves left by those who had eaten. ¹⁴When the people saw the sign that he had done, they said, "This is indeed the Prophet who is to come into the world!"

¹⁵Perceiving then that they were about to come and take him by force to make him king, Jesus ^bwithdrew again to the mountain by himself.

JESUS WALKS ON WATER

¹⁶When evening came, his disciples went down to the sea, ¹⁷got into a boat, and started across the sea to Capernaum. It was now dark, and Jesus had not yet come to them. ¹⁸The sea became rough because a strong wind was blowing. ¹⁹When they had rowed about three or four miles,² they saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they were frightened. ²⁰But he said to them, "It is I; do not be afraid." ²¹Then they were glad to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat was at the land to which they were going.

I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE

²²On the next day the crowd that remained on the other side of the sea saw that there had been only one boat there, and that Jesus had not entered the boat with his disciples, but that his disciples had gone away alone. ²³Other boats from Tiberias came near the place where they had eaten the bread after the Lord had given thanks. ²⁴So when the crowd saw that Jesus was not there, nor his disciples, they themselves got into the boats and went to Capernaum, seeking Jesus.

²⁵When they found him on the other side of the sea, they said to him, "Rabbi, when did you come here?" ²⁶Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you are seeking me, not because you saw signs, but because you ate your fill of the loaves. ²⁷Do not labor for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give to you. For on him God the Father has set his seal." ²⁸Then they said to him, "What must we do, to be doing t h e w o r k s of God?" ²⁹Jesus answered them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in him whom he has sent." ³⁰So they said to him, "Then what sign do you do, that we may see and believe you? What work do you perform?" ³¹Our fathers ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written, "He gave them bread from heaven to eat." ³²Jesus then said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, it was not Moses who gave you the bread from heaven, but my Father gives you the true bread from heaven. ³³For the bread of God is he who

comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.”³⁴ They said to him, “Sir, give us this bread always.”

³⁵Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst. ³⁶But I said to you that you have seen me and yet do not believe. ³⁷All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out. ³⁸For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me. ³⁹And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day. ⁴⁰For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in him should have eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day.”

⁴¹So the Jews grumbled about him, because he said, “I am the bread that came down from heaven.” ⁴²They said, “Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How does he now say, ‘I have come down from heaven?’” ⁴³Jesus answered them, “Do not grumble yourselves. ⁴⁴No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him. And I will raise him up on the last day. ⁴⁵It is written in the Prophets, ‘And they will all be taught by God.’ Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father comes to me— ⁴⁶not that anyone has seen the Father except he who is from God; he has seen the Father. ⁴⁷Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life. ⁴⁸I am the bread of life. ⁴⁹Your fathers ate the manna in the wilderness, and they died. ⁵⁰This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that one may eat of it and not die. ⁵¹I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.”

⁵²The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, “How can this man give us his flesh to eat?” ⁵³So Jesus said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. ⁵⁴Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day. ⁵⁵For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. ⁵⁶Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. ⁵⁷As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever feeds on me, he also will live because of me. ⁵⁸This is the bread that

came down from heaven, not like the bread¹ the fathers ate and died. Whoever feeds on this bread will live forever.” ⁵⁹Jesus² said these things in the synagogue, as he taught at Capernaum.

THE WORDS OF ETERNAL LIFE

⁶⁰When many of his disciples heard it, they said, “This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?” ⁶¹But Jesus, knowing in himself that his disciples were grumbling about this, said to them, “Do you take offense at this? ⁶²Then what if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? ⁶³It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh is no help at all. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. ⁶⁴But there are some of you who do not believe.” (For Jesus knew from the beginning who those were who did not believe, and who it was who would betray him.) ⁶⁵And he said, “This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father.”

⁶⁶After this many of his disciples turned back and no longer walked with him. ⁶⁷So Jesus said to the Twelve, “Do you want to go away as well?” ⁶⁸Simon Peter answered him, “Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, ⁶⁹and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God.” ⁷⁰Jesus answered them, “Did I not choose you, the Twelve? And yet one of you is a devil.” ⁷¹He spoke of Judas the son of Simon Iscariot, for he, one of the Twelve, was going to betray him.

JESUS AT THE FEAST OF BOOTHS

7 After this Jesus went about in Galilee. He would not go about in Judea, because the Jews³ were seeking to kill him. ²Now the Jews’ Feast of Booths was at hand. ³So his brothers⁴ said to him, “Leave here and go to Judea, that your disciples also may see the works you are doing. ⁴For no one works in secret if he seeks to be known openly. If you do these things, show yourself to the world.” ⁵For not even his brothers believed in him. ⁶Jesus said to them, “My time has not yet come, but your time is always here. ⁷The world cannot hate you, but it hates me because I testify about it that its works are evil. ⁸You go up to the feast. I am not⁵ going up to this feast, for my time has not yet fully come.” ⁹After saying this, he remained in Galilee.

TO READ

Chapters 4-6: Know Jesus. Know Yourself.

- They saw for themselves (John 4)
- You can know about God without knowing God (John 5)
- What God wants: Believe (John 6)

Most of us know someone who knows Jesus. Maybe it's a friend or relative. Maybe it's your 84-year-old grandma. But can you honestly say that you know Jesus for yourself?

In the fourth chapter of John, there's a story about the woman at the well. Let's call her Susan. Jesus is thirsty, sits down at a well where Susan is drawing water and asks her for a drink. By the way Susan responds, we can tell that this request is out of the ordinary. Jesus' love uses extra-ordinary methods to get the attention of ordinary people like us!

As they're talking, Susan realizes that Jesus is unlike anyone she has ever met. He talks about "living water" (4:10). Just before Susan calls the loony bin, Jesus tells her things about herself there's no way He could know! After He speaks words of life to her, Susan runs back to her town and reports to everyone, "Can this be the Christ?" (4:29). When you encounter Jesus, the most natural thing to do is tell others!

You need to see this! Because of Susan's testimony, her whole town wants to meet Jesus for themselves and later says, "It is no longer because of what you said that we believe, for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is indeed the Savior of the world" (4:42).

Everywhere Jesus goes, people encounter His love and power. Some reject Him while others believe and experience transformation (4:53, 5:8). It's important to note that Jesus' power is available only to those who encounter Jesus for themselves. It's not enough to simply go through the motions. We must meet with Jesus!

Notice the contrast between the characters in these chapters. Those who come to Jesus full of pride leave empty handed, while those who come unashamedly with their needs experience fulfillment. It's not about knowing the right words to say, it's about being real about what's on your heart with God and coming in faith.

“Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life.” - John 5:24

While Jesus readily meets the needs of those around Him, He always points to true satisfaction. He miraculously feeds the 5,000 with fish and bread, but goes on to say, “Do not labor for the food that perishes, but for the food that endures to eternal life...” (6:27). In other words, Jesus wants to take care of you — and what He has to offer is far better than a fish sandwich! Jesus is, “...the Bread of Life” (6:35) that will never grow stale or moldy. Jesus wants to give you life, and it comes by believing in Him. “Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life” (6:47).

¹⁴About the middle of the feast Jesus went up into the temple and began teaching. ¹⁵The Jews therefore marveled, saying, "How is it that this man has learning,¹ when he has never studied?" ¹⁶So Jesus answered them, "My teaching is not mine, but his who sent me. ¹⁷If anyone's will is to do God's² will, he will know whether the teaching is from God or whether I am speaking on my own authority. ¹⁸The one who speaks on his own authority seeks his own glory; but the one who seeks the glory of him who sent him is true, and in him there is no falsehood. ¹⁹Has not Moses given you the law? Yet none of you keeps the law. Why do you seek to kill me?" ²⁰The crowd answered, "You have a demon! Who is seeking to kill you?" ²¹Jesus answered them, "I did one work, and you all marvel at it. ²²Moses gave you circumcision (not that it is from Moses, but from the fathers), and you circumcise a man on the Sabbath. ²³If on the Sabbath a man receives circumcision, so that the law of Moses may not be broken, are you angry with me because on the Sabbath I made a man's whole body well? ²⁴Do not judge by appearances, but judge with right judgment."

CAN THIS BE THE CHRIST?

²⁵Some of the people of Jerusalem therefore said, "Is not this the man whom they seek to kill?" ²⁶And here he is, speaking openly, and they say nothing to him! Can it be that the authorities really know that this is the Christ? ²⁷But we know where this man comes from, and when the Christ appears, no one will know where he comes from." ²⁸So Jesus proclaimed, as he taught in the temple, "You know me, and you know where I come from?" **B u t** I have not come of my own accord. He who sent me is true, and him you do not know. ²⁹I know him, for I come from him, and he sent me." ³⁰So they were seeking to arrest him, but no one laid a hand on him, because his hour had not yet come. ³¹Yet many of the people believed in him. They said, "When the

Christ appears, will he do more signs than this man has done?"

OFFICERS SENT TO ARREST JESUS

³²The Pharisees heard the crowd muttering these things about him, and the chief priests and Pharisees sent officers to arrest him. ³³Jesus then said, "I will be with you a little longer, and then I am going to him who sent me. ³⁴You will seek me and you will not find me. Where I am you cannot come." ³⁵The Jews said to one another, "Where does this man intend to go that we will not find him? Does he intend to go to the Dispersion among the Greeks and teach the Greeks?" ³⁶What does he mean by saying, 'You will s e e k m e a n d you will not find me,' and, 'Where I am you cannot come?'"

RIVERS OF LIVING WATER

³⁷On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. ³⁸Whoever believes in me, as³ the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'" ³⁹Now this he said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

DIVISION AMONG THE PEOPLE

⁴⁰When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This really is the Prophet." ⁴¹Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee?" ⁴²Has not the Scripture said that the Christ comes from the offspring of David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" ⁴³So there was a division among the people over him. ⁴⁴Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him.

⁴⁵The officers then came to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" ⁴⁶The officers answered, "No one ever spoke like this man!" ⁴⁷The Pharisees answered them, "Have you also been deceived? ⁴⁸Have any of the authorities or the Pharisees believed in him?" ⁴⁹But this crowd that does not know the law is accursed." ⁵⁰Nicodemus, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, ⁵¹"Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" ⁵²They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? ⁵⁴but Jesus went to the Mount of Olives.
⁵⁵Early in the morning he came again to the temple. All the people came to him, and he sat down and taught them. ⁵⁶The scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery, and placing her in the midst ⁵⁷they said to him, “Teacher, this woman has been caught in the act of adultery. ⁵⁸Now in the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?” ⁵⁹This they said to test him, that they might have some charge to bring against him. Jesus bent down and wrote with his finger on the ground. ⁶⁰And as they continued to ask him, he stood up and said to them, “Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her.” ⁶¹And once more he bent down and wrote on the ground. ⁶²But when they heard it, they went away one by one, beginning with the older ones, and Jesus was left alone with the woman standing before him. ⁶³Jesus stood up and said to her, “Woman, where are they? I AM THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD

¹²Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, “I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.” ¹³So the Pharisees said to him, “You are bearing witness about yourself; your testimony is not true.” ¹⁴Jesus answered, “Even if I do bear witness about myself, my testimony is true, for I know where I came from and where I am going, but you do not know where I come from or where I am going. ¹⁵You judge according to the flesh; I judge no one. ¹⁶Yet even if I do judge, my judgment is true, for it is not I alone who judge, but I and the Father² who sent me. ¹⁷In your Law it is written that the testimony of two people is true. ¹⁸I am the one who bears witness about myself, and the Father who sent me bears witness about me.” ¹⁹They said to him therefore, “Where is your Father?” Jesus answered, “You know neither me nor my Father. If you knew me, you would know my Father also.” ²⁰These words he spoke in

the treasury, as he taught in the temple; but no one arrested him, because his hour had not yet come.

²¹So he said to them again, “I am going away, and you will seek me, and you will die in your sin. Where I am going, you cannot come.” ²²So the Jews said, “Will he kill himself, since he says, ‘Where I am going, you cannot come?’” ²³He said to them, “You are from below; I am from above. You are of this world; I am not of this world. ²⁴I told you that you would die in your sins, for unless you believe that I am he you will die in your sins.” ²⁵So they said to him, “Who are you?” Jesus said to them, “Just what I have been telling you from the beginning. ²⁶I have much to say a b o u t you and much to judge, but he who sent me is true, and I declare to the world what I have heard from him.” ²⁷They did not understand that he had been speaking to them about the Father. ²⁸So Jesus said to them, “When you have lifted up the Son of Man, then you will know that I am he, and that I do nothing on my own authority, but speak just as the Father taught me. ²⁹And he who sent me is with me. He has not left me alone, for I always do the things that are pleasing to him.” ³⁰As he was saying these things, many believed in him.

THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE

³¹So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, “If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, ³²and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.” ³³They answered him, “We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, ‘You will become free?’”

³⁴Jesus answered them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave³ to sin. ³⁵The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. ³⁶So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed. ³⁷I know that you are offspring of Abraham; yet you seek to kill me because my word finds no place in you. ³⁸I speak of what I have seen with my Father, and you do what you have heard from your father.”

YOU ARE OF YOUR FATHER THE DEVIL

³⁹They answered him, “Abraham is our father.” Jesus said to them, “If you were Abraham’s children, you would be doing

the works Abraham did,⁴⁰ but now you seek to kill me, a man who has told you the truth that I heard from God. This is not what Abraham did.⁴¹ You are doing the works your father did.” They said to him, “We were not born of sexual immorality. We have one Father—even God.”⁴² Jesus said to them, “If God were your Father, you would love me, for I came from God and I am here. I came not of my own accord, but he sent me.⁴³ Why do you not understand what I say? It is because you cannot bear to hear my word.⁴⁴ You are of your father the devil, and your will is to do your father’s desires. He was a murderer from the beginning, and has nothing to do with the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he lies, he speaks out of his own character, for he is a liar and the father of lies.⁴⁵ But because I tell the truth, you do not believe me.⁴⁶ Which one of you convicts me of sin? If I tell the truth, why do you not believe me?⁴⁷ Whoever is of God hears the words of God. The reason why you do not hear them is that you are not of God.”

BEFORE ABRAHAM WAS, I AM

⁴⁸The Jews answered him, “Are we not right in saying that you are a Samaritan and have a demon?”⁴⁹ Jesus answered, “I do not have a demon, but I honor my Father, and you dishonor me.⁵⁰ Yet I do not seek my own glory; there is One who seeks it, and he is the judge.⁵¹ Truly, truly, I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death.”⁵² The Jews said to him, “Now we know that you have a demon! Abraham died, as did the prophets, yet you say, ‘If anyone keeps my word, he will never taste death.’⁵³ Are you greater than our father Abraham, who died? And the prophets died! Who do you make yourself out to be?”⁵⁴ Jesus answered, “If I glorify myself, my glory is nothing. It is my Father who glorifies me, of whom you say, ‘He is our God.’⁵⁵ But you have not known him. I know him. If I were to say that I do not know him, I would be a liar like you, but I do know him and I keep his word.⁵⁶ Your father Abraham rejoiced that he would see my day. He saw it and was glad.”⁵⁷ So the Jews said to him, “You are not yet fifty years old, and have you seen Abraham?”⁵⁸ Jesus said to them, “Truly, truly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I am.”⁵⁹ So they picked up stones to throw at him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple.

JESUS HEALS A MAN BORN BLIND

9 As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth.² And his disciples asked him, “Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?”³ Jesus answered, “It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him.⁴ We must work the works of him who sent me while it is day; night is coming, when no one can work.⁵ As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.”⁶ Having said these things, he spat on the ground and made mud with the saliva. Then he anointed the man’s eyes with the mud⁷ and said to him, “Go, wash in the pool of Siloam” (which means Sent). So he went and washed and came back seeing.

⁸The neighbors and those who had seen him before as a beggar were saying, “Is this not the man who used to sit and beg?”⁹ Some said, “It is he.” Others said, “No, but he is like him.” He kept saying, “I am the man.”¹⁰ So they said to him, “Then how were your eyes opened?”¹¹ He answered, “The man called Jesus made mud and anointed my eyes and said to me, ‘Go to Siloam and wash.’ So I went and washed and received my sight.”¹² They said to him, “Where is he?” He said, “I do not know.”

¹³ They brought to the Pharisees the man who had formerly been blind.¹⁴ Now it was a Sabbath day when Jesus made the mud and opened his eyes.¹⁵ So the Pharisees again asked him how he had received his sight. And he said to them, “He put mud on my eyes, and I washed, and I see.”¹⁶ Some of the Pharisees said, “This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath.” But others said, “How can a man who is a sinner do such signs?” And there was a division among them.¹⁷ So they said again to the blind man, “What do you say about him, since he has opened your eyes?” He said, “He is a prophet.”

¹⁸The Jews did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight, until they called the parents of the man who had received his sight¹⁹ and asked them, “Is this your son, who you say was born blind? How then does he now see?”²⁰ His parents answered, “We know that this is our son and that he was born blind.²¹ But how he now sees we do not know, nor do we know who opened his eyes. Ask him; he is of age. He will speak for himself.”²² (His parents said these things because they feared the Jews, for the

Jews had already agreed that if anyone should confess Jesus¹ to be Christ, he was to be put out of the synagogue.)² Therefore his parents said, "He is of age; ask him."

²⁴So for the second time they called the man who had been blind and said to him, "Give glory to God. We know that this man is a sinner."²⁵ He answered, "Whether he is a sinner I do not know. One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see."²⁶ They said to him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?"²⁷ He answered them, "I have told you already, and you would not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you also want to become his disciples?"²⁸ And they reviled him, saying, "You are his disciple, but we are disciples of Moses.²⁹ We know that God has spoken to Moses, but as for this man, we do not know where he comes from."³⁰ The man answered, "Why, this is an amazing thing! You do not know where he comes from, and yet he opened my eyes."³¹ We know that God does not listen to sinners, but if anyone is a worshiper of God and does his will, God listens to him.³² Never since the world began has it been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a man born blind.³³ If this man were not from God, he could do nothing."³⁴ They answered him, "You were born in utter sin, and would you teach us?" And they cast him out.

³⁵Jesus heard that they had cast him out, and having found him he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?"³⁶ He answered, "And who is he, sir, that I may believe in him?"³⁷ Jesus said to him, "You have seen him, and it is he who is speaking to you."³⁸ He said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him.³⁹ Jesus said, "For judgment I came into this world, that those who do not see may see, and those who see may become blind."⁴⁰ Some of the Pharisees near him heard these things, and said to him, "Are we also blind?"⁴¹ Jesus said to them, "If you were blind, you would have no guilt;³ but now that you say, 'We see,' your guilt remains.

I AM THE GOOD SHEPHERD

10 "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door but climbs in by another way, that man is a thief and a robber.² But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep.³ To him the gatekeeper opens. The sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name and leads

them out.⁴ When he has brought out all his own, he goes before them, and the sheep follow him, for they know his voice.⁵ A stranger they will not follow, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of strangers."⁶ This figure of speech Jesus used with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

⁷So Jesus again said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, I am the door of the sheep.⁸ All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them.⁹ I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture.¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.¹¹ I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.¹² He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them.¹³ He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me,¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep.¹⁶ And I have other sheep that are not of this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd.¹⁷ For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again.¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father."

¹⁹There was again a division among the Jews because of these words.²⁰ Many of them said, "He has a demon, and is insane; why listen to him?"²¹ Others said, "These are not the words of one who is oppressed by a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?"

I AND THE FATHER ARE ONE

²²At that time the Feast of Dedication took place at Jerusalem. It was winter,²³ and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the colonnade of Solomon.²⁴ So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly."²⁵ Jesus answered them, "I told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name bear witness about

A JUDGE . . . WHO SAVES?

TO READ

Chapters 7-9: The Judge . . . who Saves?

- Not by appearance, but with right judgment (John 7)
- The adulteress, light, truth and freedom (John 8)
- The blind see and the seeing become blind (John 9)

When people think of the Church today, they often think of stuffy, fingerpointing people always telling others they are messed up. What's interesting is that the Gospel of John shows Jesus doing the opposite. Look to Jesus — don't look to the crowd.

In John 7, Jesus is in the temple during a religious feast and everyone is trying to figure out who He really is. Jesus' power and growing influence is intimidating to those who seek to use religion, business or politics for selfish gain. As leaders point their fingers at Jesus in accusation, His response exposes their hypocrisy and need. "None of you keep the law. . . . Do not judge by appearances, but judge with right judgment" (7:19, 24). Ultimately, no matter who we are or how perfect we appear, no one can keep God's law perfectly. We all need a Savior.

In John 8, leaders bring a woman guilty of sin before Jesus. According to their law, she deserves death, and they want to see how this "loving" teacher responds. To the shock of everyone, Jesus leaves the crowd to stand next to the guilty woman! He says, "Let him who is without sin among you be the first to throw a stone at her" (8:7). As the leaders walk away, Jesus looks to the woman and says, "Neither do I condemn you; go, and from now on sin no more" (8:11). Religion tries to make faith all about rules and judgment. Jesus came to give you love and power to live the life you were made for.

As God, Jesus has every right to judge us. We sin; Jesus didn't. He says, "everyone who practices sin is a slave to sin" (8:34). Yet just after this Jesus says, "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (8:36).

The very One who has the right to judge you and me is the One who stands up for us and saves us from our sin. No one says it better than Jesus after He heals a man born blind: “For judgment I came into this world,” Jesus said, “that those who do not see may see, and those who see may become blind” (9:39).

³¹The Jews picked up stones again to stone him. ³²Jesus answered them, "I have shown you many good works from the Father; for which of them are you going to stone me?" ³³The Jews answered him, "It is not for a good work that we are going to stone you but for blasphemy, because you, being a man, make yourself God." ³⁴Jesus answered them, "Is it not written in your Law,^a 'I said, you are gods?' ³⁵If he called them gods to whom the word of God came—and Scripture cannot be broken— ³⁶do you say of him whom the Father consecrated and sent into the world, 'You are blaspheming,' because I said, 'I am the Son of God?' ³⁷If I am not doing the works of my Father, then do not believe me; ³⁸but if I do them, even though you do not believe me, believe the works, that you may know and understand that the Father is in me and I am in the Father." ³⁹Again they sought to arrest him, but he escaped from their hands.

⁴⁰He went away again across the Jordan to the place where John had been baptizing at first, and there he remained. ⁴¹And many came to him. And they said, "John did no sign, but everything that John said about this man was true." ⁴²And many believed in him there.

THE DEATH OF LAZARUS

11 Now a certain man was ill, Lazarus of Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. ²It was Mary who anointed the Lord with ointment and wiped his feet with her hair, whose brother Lazarus was ill. ³So the sisters sent to him, saying, "Lord, he whom you love is ill." ⁴But when Jesus heard it he said, "This illness does not lead to death. It is for the glory of God, so that the Son of God may be glorified through it."

⁵Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. ⁶So, when he heard that Lazarus² was ill, he stayed two days longer in the place where he was. ⁷Then after this he said to the disciples, "Let us go to Judea again." ⁸The

disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just now seeking to stone you, and are you going there again?" ⁹Jesus answered, "Are there not twelve hours in the day? If anyone walks in the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. ¹⁰But if anyone walks in the night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him." ¹¹After saying these things, he said to them, "Our friend Lazarus has fallen asleep, but I go to awaken him." ¹²The disciples said to him, "Lord, if he has fallen asleep, he will recover." ¹³Now Jesus had spoken of his death, but they thought that he meant taking rest in sleep. ¹⁴Then Jesus told them plainly, "Lazarus has died, ¹⁵and for your sake I am glad that I was not there, so that you may believe. But let us go to him." ¹⁶So Thomas called the Twin,³ said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go, that we may die with him."

I AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE

¹⁷Now when Jesus came, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days. ¹⁸Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles⁴ off, ¹⁹and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary to console them concerning their brother. ²⁰So when Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went and met him, but Mary remained seated in the house. ²¹Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. ²²But even now I know that whatever you ask from God, God will give you." ²³Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." ²⁴Martha said to him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day." ²⁵Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life.⁵ Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, ²⁶and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?" ²⁷She said to him, "Yes, Lord; I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, who is coming into the world."

JESUS WEEPS

²⁸When she had said this, she went and called her sister Mary, saying in private, "The Teacher is here and is calling for you." ²⁹And when she heard it, she rose quickly and went to him. ³⁰Now Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still in the place where Martha had met him. ³¹When the Jews who were with her in the house, consoling her, saw

Mary rise quickly and go out, they followed her, supposing that she was going to the tomb to weep there. ³²Now when Mary came to where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet, saying to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

³³When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in his spirit and greatly troubled. ³⁴And he said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." ³⁵Jesus wept. ³⁶So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" ³⁷But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man also have kept this man from dying?"

JESUS RAISES LAZARUS

³⁸Then Jesus, deeply moved again, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone lay against it. ³⁹Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, by this time there will be an odor, for he has been dead four days." ⁴⁰Jesus said to her, "Did I not tell you that if you believed you would see the glory of God?" ⁴¹So they took away the stone. And Jesus lifted up his eyes and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. ⁴²I knew that you always hear me, but I said this on account of the people standing around, that they may believe that you sent me." ⁴³When he had said these things, he cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out." ⁴⁴The man who had died came out, his hands and feet bound with linen strips, and his face wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

THE PLOT TO KILL JESUS

⁴⁵Many of the Jews therefore, who had come with Mary and had seen what he did, believed in him, ⁴⁶but some of them went to the Pharisees and told them what Jesus had done. ⁴⁷So the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered the Council and said, "What are we to do? For this man performs many signs. ⁴⁸If we let him go on like this, everyone will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and our nation." ⁴⁹But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all. ⁵⁰Nor do you understand that it is better for you that one man should die for the people, not that the whole nation should perish." ⁵¹He did not say this

of his own accord, but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus would die for the nation, ⁵²and not for the nation only, but also to gather into one the children of God who are scattered abroad. ⁵³So from that day on they made plans to put him to death.

⁵⁴Jesus therefore no longer walked openly among the Jews, but went from there to the region near the wilderness, to a town called Ephraim, and there he stayed with the disciples.

⁵⁵Now the Passover of the Jews was at hand, and many went up from the country to Jerusalem before the Passover to purify themselves. ⁵⁶They were looking for¹ Jesus and saying to one another as they stood in the temple, "What do you think? That he will not come to the feast at all?" ⁵⁷Now the chief priests and the Pharisees had given orders that if anyone knew where he was, he should let them know, so that they might arrest him.

MARY ANOINTS JESUS AT BETHANY

12 Six days before the Passover, Jesus therefore came to Bethany, where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ²So they gave a dinner for him there. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those reclining with him at table. ³Mary therefore took a pound² of expensive ointment made from pure nard, and anointed the feet of Jesus and wiped his feet with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. ⁴But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (he who was about to betray him), said, ⁵"Why was this ointment not sold for three hundred denarii³ and given to the poor?" ⁶He said this, not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief, and having charge of the moneybag he used to help himself to what was put into it. ⁷Jesus said, "Leave her alone, so that she may keep it⁴ for the day of my burial. ⁸For the poor you always have with you, but you do not always have me."

THE PLOT TO KILL LAZARUS

⁹When the large crowd of the Jews learned that Jesus⁵ was there, they came, not only on account of him but also to see Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. ¹⁰So the chief priests made plans to put Lazarus to death as well, ¹¹because on account of him many of the Jews were going away and believing in Jesus.

THE TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

¹²The next day ^athe large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. ¹³So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" ¹⁴And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written,

¹⁵ ^b"Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!"

¹⁶His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. ¹⁷The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. ¹⁸The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. ¹⁹So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

SOME GREEKS SEEK JESUS

²⁰Now among those who went up to worship at the feast were some Greeks. ²¹So these came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and asked him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." ²²Philip went and told Andrew; Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. ²³And Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. ²⁴Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. ²⁵Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. ²⁶If anyone serves me, he must follow me; and where I am, there will my servant be also. If anyone serves me, the Father will honor him.

THE SON OF MAN MUST BE LIFTED UP

²⁷"Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. ²⁸Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." ²⁹The crowd that stood there and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." ³⁰Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not mine. ³¹Now is the
j u d g m e n t

of this world; now will the ruler of this world be cast out. ³²And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ³³He said this to show by what kind of death he was going to die. ³⁴So the crowd answered him, "We have heard from the Law that the Christ remains forever. How can you say that the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?" ³⁵So Jesus said to them, "The light is among you for a little while longer. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you. The one who walks in the darkness does not know where he is going. ³⁶While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light."

THE UNBELIEF OF THE PEOPLE

When Jesus had said these things, he departed and hid himself from them. ³⁷Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him, ³⁸so that the word spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

^c"Lord, who has believed what he heard from us, and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?"

³⁹Therefore they could not believe. For again Isaiah said,

⁴⁰ ^d"He has blinded their eyes and hardened their heart, lest they see with their eyes, and understand with their heart, and turn, and I would heal them."

⁴¹Isaiah said these things because he saw his glory and spoke of him. ⁴²Nevertheless, many even of the authorities believed in him, but for fear of the Pharisees they did not confess it, so that they would not be put out of the synagogue; ⁴³for they loved the glory that comes from man more than the glory that comes from God.

JESUS CAME TO SAVE THE WORLD

⁴⁴And Jesus cried out and said, "Whoever believes in me, believes not in me but in him who sent me. ⁴⁵And whoever sees me sees him who sent me. ⁴⁶I have come into the world as light, so that whoever believes in me may not remain in darkness. ⁴⁷If anyone hears my words and does not keep them, I do not judge him; for I did not come to judge the world but to save the world. ⁴⁸The
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rejects me and does not receive my words has a judge; the word that I have spoken will

judge him on the last day.⁴⁹For I have not spoken on my own authority, but the Father who sent me has himself given me a commandment—what to say and what to speak.⁵⁰And I know that his commandment is eternal life. What I say, therefore, I say as the Father has told me.”

JESUS WASHES THE DISCIPLES' FEET

13 Now before the Feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end.² During supper, when the devil had already put it into the heart of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him,³ Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going back to God,⁴ rose from supper. He laid aside his outer garments, and taking a towel, tied it around his waist.⁵ Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him.⁶ He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, “Lord, do you wash my feet?”⁷ Jesus answered him, “What I am doing you do not understand now, but afterward you will understand.”⁸ Peter said to him, “You shall never wash my feet.” Jesus answered him, “If I do not wash you, you have no share with me.”⁹ Simon Peter said to him, “Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!”¹⁰ Jesus said to him, “The one who has bathed does not need to wash, except for his feet,¹ but is completely clean. And you² are clean, but not every one of you.”¹¹ For he knew who was to betray him; that was why he said, “Not all of you are clean.”

¹² When he had washed their feet and put on his outer garments and resumed his place, he said to them, “Do you understand what I have done to you?¹³ You call me Teacher and Lord, and you are right, for so I am.¹⁴ If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet.¹⁵ For I have given you an example, that you also should do just as I have done to you.¹⁶ Truly, truly, I say to you, a servant³ is not greater than his master, nor is a messenger greater than the one who sent him.¹⁷ If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them.¹⁸ I am not speaking of all of you; I know whom I have chosen. But the Scripture will be fulfilled,⁴ ‘He who ate my bread has lifted his heel against me.’¹⁹ I am telling you this now, before it takes place, that when it does take place you may believe that I am he.²⁰ Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever

receives the one I send receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me.”

ONE OF YOU WILL BETRAY ME

²¹ After saying these things, Jesus was troubled in his spirit, and testified, “Truly, truly, I say to you, one of you will betray me.”²² The disciples looked at one another, uncertain of whom he spoke.²³ One of his disciples, whom Jesus loved, was reclining at table close to Jesus,⁵ so Simon Peter motioned to him to ask Jesus⁶ of whom he was speaking.²⁵ So that disciple, leaning back against Jesus, said to him, “Lord, who is it?”²⁶ Jesus answered, “It is he to whom I will give this morsel of bread when I have dipped it.” So when he had dipped the morsel, he gave it to Judas, the son of Simon Iscariot.²⁷ Then after he had taken the morsel, Satan entered into him. Jesus said to him, “What you are going to do, do quickly.”²⁸ Now no one at the table knew why he said this to him.²⁹ Some thought that, because Judas had the moneybag, Jesus was telling him, “Buy what we need for the feast,” or that he should give something to the poor.³⁰ So, after receiving the morsel of bread, he immediately went out. And it was night.

A NEW COMMANDMENT

³¹ When he had gone out, Jesus said, “Now is the Son of Man glorified, and God is glorified in him.³² If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself, and glorify him at once.³³ Little children, yet a little while I am with you. You will seek me, and just as I said to the Jews, so now I also say to you, ‘Where I am going you cannot come.’³⁴ A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another.³⁵ By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

JESUS FORETELLS PETER'S DENIAL

³⁶ Simon Peter said to him, “Lord, where are you going?” Jesus answered him, “Where I am going you cannot follow me now, but you will follow afterward.”³⁷ Peter said to him,

“I am the Good Shepherd who lays down His life for the sheep.”

- John 10:11

What's with the sheep? In Jesus' day, shepherds and sheep were commonly seen throughout the countryside. Shepherding was a hard and thankless job with long hours and little pay. Shepherds spend their days surrounded by smelly little animals that were totally dependent on the shepherd to eat, find fresh water and safety. Sheep are helpless on their own.

When Jesus said, “I am the Good Shepherd,” people understood. Like sheep need a shepherd to survive, we need Jesus. Like a good shepherd protects his or her sheep, Jesus protects and even lays down His life for us. Like the shepherd must protect against predators, Jesus protects us. He says: “The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly” (10:10). In a dark and dangerous world, Jesus offers life to the full.

Jesus is far more than a good teacher, self-help coach or paid hourly counselor. As the one who gave His life for you, Jesus demonstrates His willingness to go to any and every extreme for you (Romans 5:8). There is no limit to how far Jesus will go to prove His love for you.

In John 11, Jesus friend' Lazarus dies, and He weeps at the loss of His friend (11:35). As fully God, Jesus has power over death. As fully man, Jesus experiences the deep pain and sorrow that comes from loss. As man, Jesus understands whatever pain you are going through. As God, Jesus is able to carry you through.

When Jesus and His followers arrive at Lazarus' tomb, it has already been four days since he died. After witnessing the sadness surrounding the scene, Jesus turns to His friends and says, "I am the Resurrection and the Life. Whoever believes in Me, though he die, yet shall he live, and everyone who lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?" (11:25-26). Next, Jesus does something unbelievable. He raises Lazarus from the dead!

Jesus offers life, power and healing! The question is... are you alive?

Jesus tells the gathering crowds: "The one who walks in the darkness does not know where he is going. While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light" (12:35-36). When you try to find life on our own, you end up lost and broken. Jesus is the light and life you are longing for. "I have come into the world as light, so that whoever believes in Me may not remain in darkness" (12:46).

When you surrender to Jesus, His light exposes you darkness and begins to transform you into a child of light.

I AM THE WAY, AND THE TRUTH, AND THE LIFE

14 "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God;¹ believe also in me. ²In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?² ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also. ⁴And you know the way to where I am going."³ ⁵Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" ⁶Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. ⁷If you had known me, you would have known my Father also.⁴ From now on you do know him and have seen him."

⁸Philip said to him, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is enough for us." ⁹Jesus said to him, "Have I been with you so long, and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'? ¹⁰Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I say to you I do not speak on my own authority, but the Father who dwells in me does his works. ¹¹Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else believe on account of the works themselves.

¹²"Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father. ¹³Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son. ¹⁴If you ask me⁵ anything in my name, I will do it.

JESUS PROMISES THE HOLY SPIRIT

¹⁵"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper,⁶ to be with you forever, ¹⁷even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you.

¹⁸"I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. ¹⁹Yet a little while and the world will see me no more, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live. ²⁰In that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you

in me, and I in you. ²¹Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me. And he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him."²² Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, "Lord, how is it that you will manifest yourself to us, and not to the world?" ²³Jesus answered him, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. ²⁴Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me.

²⁵"These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. ²⁶But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. ²⁷Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. ²⁸You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I will come to you.' If you loved me, you would have rejoiced, because I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. ²⁹And now I have told you before it takes place, so that when it does take place you may believe. ³⁰I will no longer talk much with you, for the ruler of this world is coming. He has no claim on me, ³¹but I do as the Father has commanded me, so that the world may know that I love the Father. Rise, let us go from here.

I AM THE TRUE VINE

15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. ²Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. ³Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. ⁷If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. ⁹As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰If

you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

¹²"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends. ¹⁴You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵No longer do I call you servants,¹ for the servant² does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. ¹⁷These things I command you, so that you will love one another.

THE HATRED OF THE WORLD

¹⁸"If the world hates you, know that it has hated me before it hated you. ¹⁹If you were of the world, the world would love you as its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. ²⁰Remember the word that I said to you: 'A servant is not greater than his master.' If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you. If they kept my word, they will also keep yours. ²¹But all these things they will do to you on account of my name, because they do not know him who sent me. ²²If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not have been guilty of sin,³ but now they have no excuse for their sin. ²³Whoever hates me hates my Father also. ²⁴If I had not done among them the works that no one else did, they would not be guilty of sin, but now they have seen and hated both me and my Father. ²⁵But the word that is written in their Law must be fulfilled: ^a"They hated me without a cause.'

²⁶"But when the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness about me. ²⁷And you also will bear witness, because you have been with me from the beginning.

16 "I have said all these things to you to keep you from falling away. ²They will put you out of the synagogues. Indeed, the hour is coming when whoever kills you will think he is offering service to God. ³And they will do these things because they have not known the Father, nor me. ⁴But I have said these things to you, that when their hour comes you may

remember that I told them to you.

THE WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

"I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵But now I am going to him who sent me, and none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' ⁶But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your heart. ⁷Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: ⁹concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will see me no longer; ¹¹concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.

¹²"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

YOUR SORROW WILL TURN INTO JOY

¹⁶"A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me." ¹⁷So some of his disciples said to one another, "What is this that he says to us, 'A little while, and you will not see me, and again a little while, and you will see me'; and, 'because I am going to the Father?'" ¹⁸So they were saying, "What does he mean by 'a little while'? We do not know what he is talking about." ¹⁹Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him, so he said to them, "Is this what you are asking yourselves, what I meant by saying, 'A little while and you will not see me, and again a little while and you will see me?'" ²⁰Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice. You will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy. ²¹When a woman is giving birth, she has sorrow because her hour has come, but when she has delivered the baby, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a human being has been born into the world. ²²So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. ²³In that day you will ask nothing of me. Truly, truly, I say to you,

THE LOVE REVOLUTION

TO READ

Chapters 13-15: The Love Revolution

- The Example and New Commandment (John 13)
- The Holy Spirit to transform us (John 14)
- The Power to live and love our enemies (John 15)

You cannot know Jesus and stay the same. His love is humbling and transformational.

On the night Jesus is betrayed by one of His followers, He takes a towel and bowl of water and washes His followers' feet. Normally, this nasty job of cleaning others' toe jam would be left for a servant, not a Savior.

Everything Jesus did was on purpose. By washing His followers' feet, Jesus is showing the counter-cultural nature of His Kingdom. In John 13:12-17, Jesus explains: "Just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (13:34).

Just think about it — Jesus could have come to earth and taken over His rightful place as King, but He didn't. Instead, He came as a poor carpenter's son, born in a manger. Instead of commanding all to bow down before His power and embracing the thrones of the world, Jesus came as a servant and embraced the cross. This is a love the world has never seen before. This is revolutionary. When you love like Jesus, the world cannot help but notice.

But how can we follow someone who lived such a radical, powerful life?

Jesus has not left you and I alone. He has given us brothers and sisters (fellow believers) to journey, hold accountable and encourage. Further, Jesus has given us His very Spirit — the same Spirit that gave Him power over life and death. "And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, to be with you forever" (14:16). As Jesus explains, God gives us His Spirit, who we know as the Holy Spirit, to live in us. It's the Holy Spirit who continues to work in us, making those who believe in Jesus more like Him.

After giving everything necessary to live for Him, Jesus offers the secret of it all — SPEND TIME WITH ME. By giving the illustration of a healthy vine and branches, Jesus shows that without daily time with Him, we will wither and die instead of bearing fruit as He intends. God wants to fill you with power for today. Spend time with Him!

I HAVE OVERCOME THE WORLD

²⁵I have said these things to you in figures of speech. The hour is coming when I will no longer speak to you in figures of speech but will tell you plainly about the Father. ²⁶In that day you will ask in my name, and I do not say to you that I will ask the Father on your behalf; ²⁷for the Father himself loves you, because you have loved me and have believed that I came from God.¹ ²⁸I came from the Father and have come into the world, and now I am leaving the world and going to the Father.”

²⁹His disciples said, “Ah, now you are speaking plainly and not using figurative speech! ³⁰Now we know that you know all things and do not need anyone to question you; this is why we believe that you came from God.” ³¹Jesus answered them, “Do you now believe? ³²Behold, the hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each to his own home, and will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone, for the Father is with me. ³³I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.”

THE HIGH PRIESTLY PRAYER

17 When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, “Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son that the Son may glorify you, ²since you have given him authority over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. ³And this is eternal life, that they know you the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. ⁴I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do. ⁵And now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had with you before the world existed.

⁶“I have manifested your name to the people whom you gave me out of the world. Yours they were, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. ⁷Now they know that everything that you have given me

is from you. ⁸For I have given them the words that you gave me, and they have received them and have come to know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. ⁹I am praying for them. I am not praying for the world but for those whom you have given me, for they are yours. ¹⁰All mine are yours, and yours are mine, and I am glorified in them. ¹¹And I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ¹²While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. ¹⁴I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one.² ¹⁶They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them³ in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹And for their sake I consecrate myself;⁴ that they also may be sanctified⁵ in truth.

²⁰“I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, ²¹that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me. ²²The glory that you have given me I have given to them, that they may be one even as we are one, ²³I in them and you in me, that they may become perfectly one, so that the world may know that you sent me and loved them even as you loved me. ²⁴Father, I desire that they also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory that you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world. ²⁵O righteous Father, even though the world does not know you, I know you, and these know that you have sent me. ²⁶I made known to them your name, and I will continue to make it known, that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them.”

BETRAYAL AND ARREST OF JESUS

18 When Jesus had spoken these words, he went out with his disciples across the Kidron Valley, where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. ²Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, for Jesus often met there with his disciples. ³So Judas, having procured a band of soldiers and some officers from the chief priests and the Pharisees, went there with lanterns and torches and weapons. ⁴Then Jesus, knowing all that would happen to him, came forward and said to them, "Whom do you seek?" ⁵They answered him, "Jesus of Nazareth." Jesus said to them, "I am he."¹ Judas, who betrayed him, was standing with them. ⁶When Jesus² said to them, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground. ⁷So he asked them again, "Whom do you seek?" And they said, "Jesus of Nazareth." ⁸Jesus answered, "I told you that I am he. So, if you seek me, let these men go."⁹ This was to fulfill the word that he had spoken: "Of those whom you gave me I have lost not one." ¹⁰Then Simon Peter, having a sword, drew it and struck the high priest's servant³ and cut off his right ear. (The servant's name was Malchus.) ¹¹So Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword into its sheath; shall I not drink the cup that the Father has given me?"

JESUS FACES ANNAS AND CAIAPHAS

¹²So the band of soldiers and their captain and the officers of the Jews arrested Jesus and bound him. ¹³First they led him to Annas, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year. ¹⁴It was Caiaphas who had advised the Jews that it would be expedient that one man should die for the people.

PETER DENIES JESUS

¹⁵Simon Peter followed Jesus, and so did another disciple. Since that disciple was known to the high priest, he entered with Jesus into the court of the high priest, ¹⁶but Peter stood outside at the door. So the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out and spoke to the servant girl who kept watch at the door, and brought Peter in. ¹⁷The servant girl at the door said to Peter, "You also are not one of this man's disciples, are you?" He said, "I am not." ¹⁸Now the servants⁴ and officers had made a charcoal fire, because it was cold,

and they were standing and warming themselves. Peter also was with them, standing and warming himself.

THE HIGH PRIEST QUESTIONS JESUS

¹⁹The high priest then questioned Jesus about his disciples and his teaching. ²⁰Jesus answered him, "I have spoken openly to the world. I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret. ²¹Why do you ask me? Ask those who have heard me what I said to them; they know what I said." ²²When he had said these things, one of the officers standing by struck Jesus with his hand, saying, "Is that how you answer the high priest?" ²³Jesus answered him, "If what I said is wrong, bear witness about the wrong; but if what I said is right, why do you strike me?" ²⁴Annas then sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest.

PETER DENIES JESUS AGAIN

²⁵Now Simon Peter was standing and warming himself. So they said to him, "You also are not one of his disciples, are you?" He denied it and said, "I am not." ²⁶One of the servants of the high priest, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, asked, "Did I not see you in the garden with him?" ²⁷Peter again denied it, and at once a rooster crowed.

JESUS BEFORE PILATE

²⁸Then they led Jesus from the house of Caiaphas to the governor's headquarters.⁵ It was early morning. They themselves did not enter the governor's headquarters, so that they would not be defiled, but could eat the Passover. ²⁹d So Pilate went outside to them and said, "What accusation do you bring against this man?" ³⁰They answered him, "If this man were not doing evil, we would not have delivered him over to you." ³¹Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and judge him by your own law." The Jews said to him, "It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death."⁶ ³²This was to fulfill the word that Jesus had spoken to show by what kind of death he was going to die.

MY KINGDOM IS NOT OF THIS WORLD

³³So Pilate entered his headquarters again and called Jesus and said to him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" ³⁴Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say

it to you about me?" ³⁵Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered you over to me. What have you done?"

³⁶Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world." ³⁷Then Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." ³⁸Pilate said to him, "What is truth?"

After he had said this, he went back outside to the Jews and told them, "I find no guilt in him. ^{39a}But you have a custom that I should release one man for you at the Passover. So do you want me to release to you the King of the Jews?" ⁴⁰They cried out again, "Not this man, but Barabbas!" Now Barabbas was a robber.¹

JESUS DELIVERED TO BE CRUCIFIED

19 Then Pilate took Jesus and flogged him. ²And the soldiers twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on his head and arrayed him in a purple robe. ³They came up to him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and struck him with their hands. ⁴Pilate went out again and said to them, "See, I am bringing him out to you that you may know that I find no guilt in him." ⁵So Jesus came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, "Behold the man!" ⁶When the chief priests and the officers saw him, they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him, for I find no guilt in him." ⁷The Jews answered him, "We have a law, and according to that law he ought to die because he has made himself the Son of God." ⁸When Pilate heard this statement, he was even more afraid. ⁹He entered his headquarters again and said to Jesus, "Where are you from?" But Jesus gave him no answer. ¹⁰So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have authority to release you and authority to crucify you?" ¹¹Jesus answered him, "You would have no authority over me at all unless it had been given you from above. Therefore he who delivered me over to you has the greater sin."

¹²From then on Pilate sought to release him, but the Jews cried out, "If you release this man, you are not Caesar's friend. Everyone who makes himself a king opposes Caesar." ¹³So when Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called The Stone Pavement, and in Aramaic² Gabbatha. ¹⁴Now it was the day of Preparation of the Passover. It was about the sixth hour.³ He said to the Jews, "Behold your King!" ¹⁵They cried out, "Away with him, away with him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your King?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but C a e s a r . . ." ¹⁶So he delivered him over to them to be crucified.

THE CRUCIFIXION

So they took Jesus, ¹⁷and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called The Place of a Skull, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. ¹⁸There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, and Jesus between them. ¹⁹Pilate also wrote an inscription and put it on the cross. It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." ²⁰Many of the Jews read this inscription, for the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city, and it was written in Aramaic, in Latin, and in Greek. ²¹So the chief priests of the Jews said to Pilate, "Do not write, 'The King of the Jews,' but rather, 'This man said, I am King of the Jews.'" ²²Pilate answered, "What I have written I have written."

²³When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his garments and divided them into four parts, one part for each soldier; also his tunic.⁴ But the tunic was seamless, woven in one piece from top to bottom,^{4a} so they said to one another, "Let us not tear it, but cast lots for it to see whose it shall be." This was to fulfill the Scripture which says,

^b"They divided my garments among them,
and for my clothing they cast lots."

So the soldiers did these things, ²⁵but standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son!" ²⁷Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother!" And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.

THE DEATH OF JESUS

²⁸After this, Jesus, knowing that all was now

TO READ

Chapters 16-18: A New Way of Life

- A new kind of victory (John 16)
- A new kind of people (John 17)
- A new kind of kingdom (John 18)

Jesus is the King. He's a King unlike any the world has ever known: Defined by love, holy in power, blameless in life and fully focused on the Kingdom to come. While many rulers use power for selfish gain, Jesus used His — even His life — to free and empower His people. This was a divine monarchy where the King's victory was truly the people's victory. Our victory demanded everything from our King!

In John 17, we get a “behind the scenes” view into Jesus' desire that we be a new kind of people. With His last prayer, He prays for us! “I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word” (17:20).

His prayer is that we would be defined by our love, perseverance and unity. The world claws and competes for attention and “success,” yet give up at the first sign of opposition. Jesus prays that we would demonstrate His reality by standing up for one another and sticking it out through thick and thin.

How serious is Jesus about His mission and message? No matter how riveting His speeches or powerful His miracles, what unfolds beginning with John 18 tells the real story. Jesus is betrayed by Judas, one of His closest followers, and arrested. Have you experienced betrayal or abandonment from someone you love? Jesus can relate. Later on, Peter (Jesus most outspoken and seemingly passionate follower), denies even knowing Jesus (18:25).

As Jesus is taken before religious and political leaders, He has every opportunity to escape what is to come, but He never flinches. “My kingdom is not of this world. If My kingdom were of this world, My servants would have been fighting” (18:36).

Jesus comes as a King to call the world to the Truth — Himself. Jesus is the Good Shepherd and Courageous King who gives Himself in love for His disobedient people. Jesus is a King with a new kind of kingdom — a Kingdom that is yet to come for those who believe!

finished, said (to fulfill the Scripture), “I thirst.”²⁹ A jar full of sour wine stood there, so they put a sponge full of the sour wine on a hyssop branch and held it to his mouth. ³⁰When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, “It is finished,” and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

JESUS’ SIDE IS PIERCED

³¹Since it was the day of Preparation, and so that the bodies would not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), the Jews asked Pilate that their legs might be broken and that they might be taken away. ³²So the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first, and of the other who had been crucified with him. ³³But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. ³⁴But one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. ³⁵He who saw it has borne witness—his testimony is true, and he knows that he is telling the truth—that you also may believe. ³⁶For these things took place that the Scripture might be fulfilled: ^a “Not one of his bones will be broken.” ³⁷And again another Scripture says, ^b “They will look on him whom they have pierced.”

JESUS IS BURIED

³⁸^cAfter these things Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly for fear of the Jews, asked Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus, and Pilate gave him permission. So he came and took away his body. ³⁹Nicodemus also, who earlier had come to Jesus¹ by night, came bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about seventy-five pounds² in weight. ⁴⁰So they took the body of Jesus and bound it in linen cloths with the spices, as is the burial custom of the Jews. ⁴¹Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb in which no one had yet been laid. ⁴²So because of the Jewish day of Preparation, since the tomb was close at hand, they laid Jesus there.

THE RESURRECTION

20 Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene came to the tomb early, while it was still dark, and saw that the stone had been taken away from the tomb. ²So she

ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, “They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him.” ³So Peter went out with the other disciple, and they were going toward the tomb. ⁴Both of them were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵And stooping to look in, he saw the linen cloths lying there, but he did not go in. ⁶Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen cloths lying there, ⁷and the face cloth, which had been on Jesus’³ head, not lying with the linen cloths but folded up in a place by itself. ⁸Then the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; ⁹for as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that he must rise from the dead. ¹⁰Then the disciples went back to their homes.

JESUS APPEARS TO MARY MAGDALENE

¹¹But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb, and as she wept she stooped to look into the tomb. ¹²And she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had lain, one at the head and one at the feet. ¹³They said to her, “Woman, why are you weeping?” She said to them, “They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him.” ¹⁴Having said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵Jesus said to her, “Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?” Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, “Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away.” ¹⁶Jesus said to her, “Mary.” She turned and said to him in Aramaic,⁴ “Rabboni!” (which means Teacher). ¹⁷Jesus said to her, “Do not cling to me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to my brothers and say to them, ‘I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.’” ¹⁸Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, “I have seen the Lord”—and that he had said these things to her.

JESUS APPEARS TO THE DISCIPLES

¹⁹On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, “Peace be with you.” ²⁰When he had said

this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²²And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld."

JESUS AND THOMAS

²⁴Now Thomas, one of the Twelve, called the Twin,¹ was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe."

²⁶Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." ²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

THE PURPOSE OF THIS BOOK

³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

JESUS APPEARS TO SEVEN DISCIPLES

21 After this Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way. ²Simon Peter, Thomas (called the Twin), Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples were together. ³Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

⁴Just as day was breaking, Jesus stood on the shore; yet the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. ⁵Jesus said to them, "Children, do you have any fish?" They answered him,

"No." ⁶He said to them, "Cast the net on the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in, because of the quantity of fish. ⁷That disciple whom Jesus loved therefore said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on his outer garment, for he was stripped for work, and threw himself into the sea. ⁸The other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, but about a hundred yards² off.

⁹When they got out on land, they saw a charcoal fire in place, with fish laid out on it, and bread. ¹⁰Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." ¹¹So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, 153 of them. And although there were so many, the net was not torn. ¹²Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. ¹³Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish. ¹⁴This was now the third time that Jesus was revealed to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

JESUS AND PETER

¹⁵When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Feed my lambs." ¹⁶He said to him a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." He said to him, "Tend my sheep." ¹⁷He said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was grieved because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. ¹⁸Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you used to dress yourself and walk wherever you wanted, but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will dress you and carry you where you do not want to go." ¹⁹(This he said to show by what kind of death he was to glorify God.) And after saying this he said to him, "Follow me."

JESUS AND THE BELOVED APOSTLE

²⁰Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them, the one who had

been reclining at table close to him and had said, "Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?"

²¹When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, "Lord, what about this man?" ²²Jesus said to him, "If it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you? You follow me!" ²³So the saying spread abroad among the brothers¹ that this disciple was not to die; yet Jesus did not say to him that he was not to die, but, "If

it is my will that he remain until I come, what is that to you?"

²⁴This is the disciple who is bearing witness about these things, and who has written these things, and we know that his testimony is true.

²⁵Now there are also many other things that Jesus did. Were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written.

The last three chapters of John describe the raw and incredible culmination of God's divine story of Jesus' life on earth.

Have you ever experienced excruciating, throbbing pain? The word "excruciating" actually started as a description the unimaginable pain one would experience through death by crucifixion.

When Jesus goes to the cross, it is the worst death imaginable . . . TRULY. The Romans were known for many things, but one thing they found extra pride in was their savvy in developing the most intense and horrifying forms of punishment. The crown jewel of their punishment methods? The crucifixion. As the King and Creator of the world, Jesus is whipped, beaten and nailed to a cross of wood to slowly suffocate.

The ordeal lasts for hours. The shock of the scene is so great that the entire earth shakes, and Roman soldiers come to faith just by witnessing what happens.

Yet the crucifixion is not even the worst pain Jesus experiences. As He hangs on that cross, Jesus carries the weight of punishment owed from every sin of humanity. Jesus is punished for you. Jesus dies for you. For three days, Jesus goes to hell for you.

Jesus, the perfect God-Man dies a criminal's death! You and I stand guilty before the high Judge of heaven and Jesus dies in our place. Jesus cries out His last words, "It is finished!" (John 19:30).

The sacrifice of Jesus on the cross is more than a valiant moral example; it is payment of our penalty, a substitution for our sin. Jesus is our salvation. He opens the door for us to be transformed, to be born again.

Proving His power, Jesus rises from the dead! He appears to women at the tomb, and then He appears to His followers later that day.

To close the book, Jesus appears to His followers before ascending into heaven. As they meet Jesus on the lakeshore, He forgives and welcomes Peter back into the fold.

The call to Peter is the call of Jesus to everyone. Though we all fall short, Jesus' sacrifice pays for our sin. We have no fear of death because Jesus conquered death. Now Jesus speaks to you, offering you to take the NEXT step into a new life. His words to you now are, "Follow Me."

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

Many times in chapter 19, the phrase "to fulfill the Scripture" comes up (John 19:24,28,36). What does this tell you about Jesus' death?

Thomas, another follower of Jesus, does not believe until he sees Jesus (John 20:25). What's Jesus' response in John 20:29?

Jesus removes all grounds for comparison and jealousy in John 21:22. What are His words to Peter?
